### **About Make the difference!**

# What is the EU-project Make the difference about?

Make the difference aims to prevent the endangerment to the welfare of children living in households with addiction issues by promoting cooperation between help systems, qualifying professionals and embedding (existing) offers for the children.



Cooperation between help systems can be a challenge. The project specifically focuses on how to reach a binding cooperation agreement between addiction care and youth welfare services and how to actually live that cooperation. For this, a practical guide with instructions will be published.

In all 12 partner countries, a cooperation agreement will be prepared, signed and implemented within the course of the project (Work package 2).

In a second work stream, professionals from both help systems will be qualified on issues concerning the target group in a joint seminar. A curriculum for such a seminar will be published (Work package 3).

Finally, as a low-threshold help offer, a mentoring programme will be offered for children from families with addiction issues (Work package 4).

## **Project meetings**

#### Digital workshop I

The first Make the difference workshop has been designed for the project partners and their local cooperation partners to get to know each other, to exchange experiences concerning working with families with addiction issues with colleagues across Europe and to jointly work on the guide towards a written cooperation agreement. This joint work should promote the cooperation of the local partners.





Initially, the workshop was planned to take place in Lanarca, Cyprus, hosted by Kenthea, the Cypriot project beneficiary. However, due to the pandemic, this first project event had to take place online instead. 55 representatives from all 12 partner countries took part in this online workshop. Among the participants were professionals from addiction care and prevention as well as professionals from youth welfare services, youth work and social services.

Project partners have been sceptical about the online format, knowing that especially with the goal of promoting cooperation, physical meetings, working together on a joint task and getting to know each other is essential.

However, with a digital collaboration tool, it has been possible to create a workshop atmosphere and to actively involve all participants. By means of a digital World café, the participants jointly worked on the content of the guide.



## **Project meetings**

After the workshop, a first draft of the guide has been prepared and handed to the project partners to start working along the indicidual modules with their local partners.

# Seminar for professionals (Work package 3)

Work package 3 is all about qualification of professionals and providing security of action. In a hybrid 3-day seminar in Belgium (Hasselt) and online, project partners and their local cooperation partners have received up-to-date information on family dynamics, stress factors and developmental risks of affected children, protective factors and how to build resilience, and roles of affected children in their families.

The addiction help professionals have been informed about youth welfare-specific issues and the youth work professionals have gained basic knowledge on addiction issues and how to address these issues with their clients. The seminar included lectures, group work, discussing individual cases and discussions about the attitudes towards families with addiction issues.

Among other aspects, participants have discussed about different attitudes towards families with addiction issues and how to address the children or parenting issues with clients in (addiction) counselling. As a good practice process ("roadmap"), the Belgian kindreflex ("child reflex") has been presented and discussed.
