## Mission and Vision

Violence against children can take many forms. Besides physical and psychological violence directed against them, growing up in a household with addiction issues can lead to serious psychological problems.

Across partner countries, 8-14 % of all drug users are living with children (EMCDDA, 2012). Until today, initiatives have mainly focused on educating professionals and developing group programmes for affected children. However, without identifying those children in the first place, these measures cannot be effective.

<u>Make the difference</u> aims to prevent the endangerment to the welfare of children living in households with addiction issues.

### Needs and Actions

#### Needs



Binding cooperation structures between youth welfare and addiction prevention at local level are needed for identifying children living in families with addiction issues and being able to offer them help.

A sustainable use of existing offers and systematic networking creates synergies, saves resources and promotes integrated care.

#### Actions

A structured guide for a binding cooperation will be prepared and implemented by professionals of both help systems. Hereby, a successful cooperation between local help providers will be built up and actually lived.

Already existing offers for the children will be embedded and supplemented by new ones bases on actual local needs.



Knowledge about services and support in one's own region and basic knowledge about addiction prevention and pedagogical work are important cornerstones. Addiction prevention professionals receive basic qualification in aspects relevant to youth welfare. On the other side, youth welfare professionals are qualified with basic knowledge of addiction prevention.

Families with addiction problems often shy away from going to youth welfare offices or counselling centres. Low-threshold services are needed to reach the target group in order to be able to offer help to the children. A mentoring approach is implemented which offers positive relationships with stable adults to the children and thereby promotes the children's protective factors.

- ... prevents the development of mental health problems for children living in families with addiction issues
